



Instructions

Propane Grill

NOTE: It is recommended that you use a long grill lighter to avoid contact with hands. Always use in a well-ventilated area- OUTDOORS IS PREFERRED

- Be sure that all valves on the grill are in the OFF position & fuel valve is closed.
- Remove grates from the grill.
- Connect propane tank and open valve.
- Open regulator valves on the grill slightly.
- Light each pilot bar- CAREFULLY!
- Replace grates on the grill.
- Turn regulator valves on the grill to desired setting.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Tighten connections to fuel tank by hand until they come to a full stop.
- Ensure that hoses are not kinked & do not come near burners or other areas that will become hot during use.
- Close fuel supply valves when the appliance is not in use.
- Before replacing a fuel tank, close its supply valve and turn off appliance
- **If you smell gas, hear a hissing sound, or see a white or icy substance near any connections, immediately close the fuel supply valve, turn off the appliance and remove any other ignition source.**
- **Do Not store spare fuel tanks in the vicinity of the appliance**
